Library Research Sources

The following is a listing of research sources normally found in a library.

Library Resources	
General Encyclopedia	A <u>book</u> or <u>numbered set</u> of books that provides basic <u>information</u> on a broad range of <u>subject</u> s but treats no single subject in depth
Subject Encyclopedia	An <u>encyclopedia</u> in one or more <u>volume</u> s devoted to a specific <u>subject</u> , <u>field</u> of study, or academic <u>discipline</u> . <u>Entries</u> in a subject encyclopedia are usually written and <u>signed</u> by an expert on the topic and may include a brief <u>bibliography</u> or list of suggested reading.
Dictionaries	Reference work containing brief explanatory entries for terms and topics related to a specific subject or field of inquiry, usually arranged alphabetically
Thesaurus	A type of Dictionary that lists groups of synonyms
Atlas	 A book or bound collection of maps, sometimes with supplementary illustrations and graphic analyses. A volume of tables, charts, or plates that systematically illustrates a particular subject
Gazetteer	A <u>separately published dictionary</u> of <u>geographic names</u> that gives the location of each <u>entry</u> . Also, an <u>index</u> of the names of the places and geographic <u>feature</u> s shown on the <u>maps</u> contained in an <u>atlas</u> , usually <u>printed</u> in a separate section following the maps, with locations indicated by <u>page number</u> (or map number) and <u>grid coordinates</u> . Some gazetteers include <u>information</u> about major geographic features such as rivers, lakes, mountains, cities, etc
Almanacs	An <u>annual compendium</u> of practical <u>dates</u> , facts, and statistics, <u>current</u> and/or <u>retrospective</u> , often arranged in <u>tables</u> to facilitate comparison.
Handbook	A book of advice and instructions
Directory	A book or database which lists the names and details of people or companies in a specific geographical or subject area.
Magazine or Periodical	A regular weekly, monthly or quarterly publication containing articles, stories, photographs and advertisements. Periodicals can be Professional, Industrial & trade or special interest in content
Newspaper	A daily or weekly publication consisting of a number of large sheets of folded cheap paper containing printed news articles and pictures
Expert	Somebody with a great deal of knowledge, or skill or experience in a particular subject or activity
Open Web	Online websites that are public and viewable by everyone

Databases	Software which enables the user to organize data for easy retrieval. A collection of data stored in a computer which can be easily and quickly retrieved.
Museums	a place or building where objects of historical, artistic, or scientific interest are exhibited, preserved, or studied
Government & Non – Government Agencies Publications	A publication with information which is written and published by government departments, often of a statistical nature.
